## **Concept Paper**

**Venue:** The Permanent Representation of Lithuania to the European Union (Rue Belliard 41-43, 1040 Brussels)

**Organizer** The Presidency of the Community of Democracies; Permanent Secretariat of the Community of Democracy in Warsaw; European Partnership for Democracy

### **Aims of the meeting:**

Czech and Swedish EU Presidencies have initiated the discussion on how to increase the coherence, effectiveness and credibility of EU support to democracy building. In this regard, Commission's and Council General Secretariat's joint paper "*Building democracy in EU external relations*", issued in July this year, as well as European Parliament resolution on democracy building in the EU's external relations (22 October 2009), were the big steps forward.

Lithuania, as the Presidency of the Community of Democracies in 2009-2011, wishes to promote this idea further and to assist EU in its democracy building efforts. Therefore we organize this first wide-ranging meeting of the representatives of the Community and Democracies, the EU institutions and member states in Brussels.

During the forthcoming General Affairs and External Relations Council (16-17 November), the EU Foreign and Development ministers will have a debate on the ways how to achieve increased coherence and effectiveness in the support of democracy building processes in EU's external relations. We foresee that our Informal Round Table meeting in Brussels will reflect upon possibilities of EU and its Member States intensifying cooperation within the Community of Democracies.

### **Discussion topics:**

- First of all, the reform of the Community of Democracies itself aiming to make it more instrumental for building and consolidating democracy in a substantial manner. We should discuss how to make it more representative, transparent and inclusive, how to involve more countries and more democracy stakeholders, such as the EU, as well as broaden geographical areas of cooperation;
- Magnification of democracy outreach by maximizing the synergy and coherence between CoD and relevant international organizations, initiatives and stakeholders, including the EU; Streamlining the cooperation at the international or regional fore between EU and the CoD;
- Thematic areas of cooperation and joint flagship projects helping to advance democracy across the Globe.

## **The Community of Democracies: History and Structure**

In July 2009, Lithuania assumed the Presidency of the Community of Democracies, comprising over 100 countries worldwide, for a two-year period ending in 2011. The goal of CoD is to strengthen and deepen democratic norms and practices worldwide. The Community of Democracies is based on the Charter of the UN and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

The Community itself was inaugurated at the first biennial ministerial conference on 25-27 June 2000 in Warsaw. The initiative of establishing the Community was spearheaded by the then Polish Foreign Minister B.Geremek and U.S. Secretary of State M.Albright along with ten conveners (the so-called Convening Group, CG): Chile, Czech Republic, India, Mali, Mexico, Poland, Portugal, South Africa, South Korea, the U.S.A. In 2006, the Convening Group was expanded by adding Cape Verde, El Salvador, Italy, Mongolia, Morocco and the Philippines. In July 2009, Lithuania assumed the presidency of the Community of Democracies and de facto became its 17-th convening member.

### **Goals of Lithuania's Presidency of the Community of Democracies:**

- Revitalizing the Community of Democracies (CoD), adjusting it to new realities, **w**elcoming new partners;
- Discussing the implications of global financial and economic crisis for democratic governance and ways of sustaining, expanding and improving it at local, national and global level, thus contributing to the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals;
- Seeking maximum synergy and coherence between CoD and relevant international organizations, initiatives and stakeholders for strengthening democracy;
- Contributing to the dialogue of civilizations, cultures, religions;
- Creating a youth and parliamentary segment of the Community.
